1. TITLE

The following Australian Titles are authorised by Motorsport Australia:

Only the outright winner will be recognised in each Title.

2. CONDITIONS

It is prohibited to attach a National or State Motorsport Australia Title to a Club Competition.

For a National Title, the Sporting and Technical Regulations must be approved by Motorsport Australia.

For a State *Title*, the Sporting Regulations must be approved by the relevant State Council. The associated Technical Regulations and any amendments thereto must only be those approved by *Motorsport Australia*.

Unless otherwise approved by *Motorsport Australia*, a *Title* must only be referred to by its full title, including the year, e.g. 2023 Motorsport Australia (Sponsor) Queensland Rally Championship; and be conducted within a calendar year.

3. EVENTS

Unless otherwise approved by Motorsport Australia:

a National *Title* must consist of at least 6 rounds in not fewer than 4 States/Territories. A round held outside of the *Territory of Motorsport Australia* in accordance with the *Code* may constitute 1 of the 4 States/Territories.

a State *Title* must consist of at least 3 rounds. Each round must be conducted within the territory of the relevant State Council. With the approval of an adjoining State Council, 1 interstate round may be included (Tasmania, Victoria and South Australia will be considered as adjoining).

a Motorkhana, Khanacross, Hill Climb or Super Sprint *Title* may be contested over 1 round

any round of a *Circuit Race Title* must have at least 10 *Automobiles* listed in the qualifying classification. Any other *Title* must have a minimum of 10 *Automobiles* commence each round.

4. POINTSCORE

With the approval of the CEO of Motorsport Australia, if a Competition forms part of a Title, any Competitor and/or Driver and/or Navigator holding a foreign Licence may be eligible to score points in that Title.

Notwithstanding, a MotorSport New Zealand Licence holder is eligible to score points in accordance with the Trans-Tasman Agreement.

The scale of points must be structured to favour the top 3 outright positions with the remaining points awarded on a diminishing scale, e.g. 25, 20, 17, 15, 13, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 or 9, 6, 4, 3, 2, 1.

Unless otherwise specified in the Sporting Regulations, if 2 or more *Drivers* score equal points, the positions will be determined by the greater number of first placings; if a tie remains the greater number of second placings; and so on. If this method does not determine the result, a tie will be declared.

5. AWARDS

Motorsport Australia will award a trophy to each *Title* winner. Unless an exemption has been granted by *Motorsport Australia*, the recipient must attend the Motorsport Australia National or State Awards presentation as relevant.

The winner of a Championship will be recognised as the Australian or State Champion as relevant and the winner of a National Series will be recognised as the "The Series Winner".

Where a class is included in a Title, the winner will be recognised as a 'Class Winner' of that Title.

6. BRANDING

The Motorsport Australia logo must be displayed in accordance with Technical Appendix - Schedule K.

Only with the permission of Motorsport Australia may a commercial brand, logo etc be associated with a Title.

The *Title* logo must be included in each *Competition* publication (e.g. regulations, entry list, result, Title standing) and each promotional item.

7. **REGISTRATION**

Any registration requirement must be specified in the relevant Sporting Regulations.

8. TELEVISION BROADCAST RIGHTS

Unless otherwise approved, the television broadcast rights of a *Competition* counting towards a *Title* are held by Motorsport Australia.

9. **DEFINITIONS**

Category: A group of Automobiles complying with technical regulations for a Title.

CRA: A Motorsport Australia agreement assigning the commercial and promotional rights associated with a *Title*.

Round: The Final Classification of a Competition which counts toward a Title.

Title: A Motorsport Australia National and/or State Championship, Cup, Trophy, Challenge or Series.
