



PETER WRIGHT MEMORIAL AWARD – 2021

1. This encouragement award will be presented annually by Motorsport Australia to a resident SA Circuit Racing Driver.
2. To receive this award, the driver must attain the highest point score from competing in a specified number of race meetings held in SA between January 1 and December 31. A driver cannot concurrently win this award and SA Racing Driver of the Year. The number of race meetings to count for this award may vary, but will be specified by the SA/NT State Council of Motorsport of Australia, and become Appendix A to these rules. All races on the program are eligible for point scoring, with the exception of team events, (eg relay race) and regularity trials. There must be a minimum of six eligible drivers starting in an event. A driver will be classified as a "starter" or "finisher" as defined in the NCRs of Motorsport Australia. The number of starters will be defined as those published on the official entry list of the "event". The "event" is defined by the description in the particular Supplementary Regulations for the Race Meeting.
3. Drivers who have won any of the following awards or titles in the previous three years - SA Racing Driver of the Year, Peter Wright Memorial Award and any State or National Circuit Racing Championship - are ineligible. The SA State Council of Motorsport Australia will establish a list in January of each year, of those drivers who are ineligible for this award, and this will become Appendix B to these rules.
4. Points will be awarded as follows:
 - a 2 points will be awarded for each race that a driver starts; and a further 2 points for each race a driver finishes.
 - b Separate categories, when combined, will be treated as separate races, provided there is the minimum of six "starters" in each category. Categories eligible for point scoring will be specified by the SA/NT State Council of Motorsport of Australia, upon recommendation by the Motor Race Panel, and become Appendix C to these rules.
 - c Points will be awarded once only, in any particular race, as:

 - d Positions attained by non-SA resident drivers in any race and drivers defined at (3) above, will be ignored for awarding points, and following eligible SA drivers will move up the race finishing order and be awarded the appropriate points.
 - e Points may be scored in one category only at any race meeting.
5. A race meeting score is obtained by dividing each driver's total score by the number of races that qualify, and for which the driver is eligible.
6. To be eligible for this award, a driver must compete in at least 3 meetings.
7. The final score is determined by averaging a driver's best 3 race meetings' scores.
8. No count back provisions apply - in the event of a tie; there shall be joint awards.

9 The SA/NT State Council of Motorsport of Australia will be the final authority for the adjudication and administration of this award.

- Circuit Excel,
- ~~Porsches complying with South Australia approved Porsche SA Series Regulations~~

Non State Championship Categories & Classes

- Historic Touring Cars: with classes for up to 3000cc and 3001cc and over,
- Historic Racing: with Classes up to 1500cc and 1501cc and over,
- MG F: With Classes for Cup, Trophy and other MGs (including approved invited British Sports Cars),
- Tarmac Rally Cars: with Classes up to 3000cc and 3001cc and over
- Superkarts: Non Gearbox Junior, Non Gearbox Light, Non Gearbox Heavy, Stock Honda, 125 Gearbox, 250 Gearbox National, 250 Gearbox International
