2020 Motorsport Australia Western Australia 3K Saloon Car Championship

D1 ELIGIBILITY

- (i) This Appendix is prepared in accordance with the 2020 Motorsport Australia Championship and Series Policy.
- (ii) The objective for the 2020 Motorsport Australia Western Australia 3k Saloon Car Championship shall be to provide a competitive and exciting racing category for Production based Type 3 vehicle complying with this Appendix and with the requirements outlined in the 2020 Motorsport Australia Manual of Motorsport: - Group 3K - Saloon Cars.
- (iii) There shall be two separate classes within the state Championship
 - Class A: (PRO) Cars complying with Motorsport Australia 3K part 2 Technical Regulations –AU Ford Falcon and VT/VX/VY/VZ Holden Commodore
 - Class B: (PRO-AM) Cars complying with Motorsport Australia 3K part 1 Technical Regulations –EA/EB Ford Falcon and VN/VP Holden Commodore
- (iiii) A Dorian timing transmitter must be fitted not forward of the front door hinges.

D2 CATEGORY ORGANISERS

- (i) The organizers of the championship shall be the Saloon Car Racing Association of WA, herein referred to as "the Organizers" WA Saloon Car Committee: salooncars@hotmail.com
- (ii) Category Manager (CM) Saloon Car Racing Association of WA

D 3 GRID DETERMINATION

The grid for each race shall be determined as follows:

Round 4 (Ernie Hastie)

Race 1 shall be determined by qualifying times fastest to slowest in each class.

The grid shall be split between Class A, first, then Class B with empty row separating class A and B.

Race 2 shall be progressive from race 1 as per Motorsport Australia 2020 R.M,S.R with the top 50% in each class reversed within their own grid, split between Class A first, then Class B with empty row separating class A and B.

Race 3 (Ernie Hastie race) The grid for Race 1 shall be split between class A determined from accumulated points from race 1 and 2 with the highest point scorer on grid position 1, 2nd highest point scorer on grid position 2 and so on. Followed by class B determined from accumulated points from Heats 1 and 2 with the highest point scorer on grid position 1, 2nd highest point scorer on grid position 2 and so on.

Round 1,2,3,5,6,7,8,9

Race 1 shall be determined by qualifying times fastest to slowest in each class.

The grid shall be split between Class A, first, then Class B with empty row separating class A and B.

Race 2 shall be progressive from race 1 as per Motorsport Australia 2020 R.M,S.R. but split between Class A first, then Class B with empty row separating class A and B.

Race 3 shall be progressive from race 2 as per Motorsport Australia 2020 R.M,S.R with the top 50% in each class reversed within their own grid, split between Class A first, then Class B with empty row separating class A and B.

D4 START PROCEDURE

The start procedure for each race will be as detailed in the RMSR, **But with a 5 to 10 second Handicap between Class A and Class B.** The start of the race for **Class A** shall be at the extinguishing of the red light. An official shall be holding a yellow flag above his head behind **Class A**, but ahead of **Class B**, and shall move away approximately 2 seconds after **Class A** has moved away. The starter shall signify the start of **Class B** by re turning on the red light and extinguishing the red light after a delay of approximately 5 to 10 seconds from the start of **Class A**.

D 5 AUTOMOBILE MARKINGS

Each automobile must display the following Series markings, appropriately attached and Positioned as detailed below at all times during each round of the Series.

The Series Markings will be provided by the Category Manager.

- Upper portion of front windscreen = Sub Sponsor
- Number Plate= Sub Sponsor
- Front guards both sides=Sub Sponsor
- Above car competition number = Sub Sponsor.

D6 DRIVING STANDARDS OBSERVERS D.S.O.

The driving standards observers will be as detailed in the RMSR.

D7 ELIGIBILITY OFFICERS E.O.

Category Eligibility officer will be as detailed in the RMSR.

D8 CHAMPIONSHIP ROUNDS AND POINTS

Round 1, A maximum of the first 4 races will receive championship points

Round 2-9 A maximum of the first 3 races will receive championship points

Point will be allocated in each class as per the 2020 Motorsport Australia Western Australia Motor Race Championship Sporting Regulations 3.3 & 3.4 (i) Point Scores.
