

# 2025 Motorsport Australia Queensland Off Road Championship Sporting Regulations



A capitalised and italicised word in this document is defined in the FIA International Sporting Code (*Code*), the National Competition Rules (*NCR*), including their Appendices or this document. Any HEADING is for reference only and has no regulatory effect.





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## **Queensland Off Road Championship (QORC)**

These Regulations have been approved by the Queensland State Council of *Motorsport Australia*. To be read in conjunction with the *Manual*.

#### 1. GENERAL

The Championship will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices; the National Competition Rules of *Motorsport Australia*; the Off-Road Standing Regulations; these Championship Regulations, such *Supplementary Regulations* and Bulletins as may be issued.

#### 2. ADMINISTRATION

The Championship organisers will be the *Event Organising Committees* under the control of the Queensland State Council of *Motorsport Australia*.

#### 3. ADVERTISING

- **3.1.** By entering any round of the QORC, each person and corporation agree to refer to it only by its full title, "The 2025 Motorsport Australia Queensland Off Road Championship".
- 3.2. All promotional material must include the full title.
- **3.3.** In any State Championship Competition and above, a Motorsport Australia logo must be placed as high as possible and clearly visible between the main roll bar hoop and the front suspension on each side of the coachwork.
- **3.4.** An Organiser may also require each Competitor to display signage promoting the Event sponsor; in such case this must be included in the Supplementary Regulations, and the Organiser will provide this signage to each Competitor.

#### 4. SCHEDULE

The 2025 Queensland Off Road Championship will comprise the following long Course Events:

#### 5. EVENT OPERATIONS

#### 5.1. STARTS

- **5.1.1.** An *Event* may include a multiple *Start* depending on track conditions. The *Start* format will be advised in *Supplementary Regulations*.
- 5.1.2. A prologue will determine the initial starting order. The starting order for the second and subsequent sections will be based on the outright finishing order of the preceding section. If the *Event* format splits the field into multiple groups, regrouping may incur within the individual groups. If seeding is required, it will be at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.
- **5.1.3.** The prologue starting order will be determined by the *Organiser*, in accordance with Article 5.2 of these Regulations, and advised by the *Organiser* to each Crew no later than the end of the first Crew briefing.
- **5.1.4.** Each *Automobile* will *Start* the prologue at the time allocated by the *Organiser*.
- **5.1.5.** The crew and *Automobile* combination completing the prologue *Course* in the least time will *Start* the first section first, followed by the remainder of the field in increasing order of time taken over the prologue *Course*





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#### 5.2. SEEDING

- **5.2.1.** The crew of an *Automobile* unable to attempt and/or not completing the prologue may, on application to the Clerk of the Course and approval by the Stewards, be seeded.
- **5.2.2.** The crew of an *Automobile* unable to attempt and/or not completing a section of an *Event* consisting of multiple sections may, on application to the Clerk of the Course and approval by the Stewards, be seeded.
- 5.2.3. There will be no right of appeal against any decision about seeding.

#### **5.3. COMPETITION NUMBERS**

- 5.3.1. Each Competitor may choose a Competition number. If a clash of numbers occurs, the Competitor or Driver that has registered a National Competition Number, allocated by Motorsport Australia, will have preference to use that number. Otherwise, preference will be given in order of Entries received at that Event.
- **5.3.2.** Each *Competition* number must comply with Article 30 of the General Requirements for Off Road Vehicles in the Off Road *Appendix* of the *Manual*.

### 5.4. TIMING & RESULTS

- **5.4.1.** Timing will be by manual or electronic means to an accuracy of 1/100<sup>th</sup> of a second.
- **5.4.2.** Each *Automobile* will be timed as its front wheels pass the timing marker of the control, or if an electronic means of timing is utilised, when the electronic timing is activated.
- **5.4.3.** The *Final Classification* of each *Event* will be determined by the total elapsed time taken by each *Automobile* for each section of the *Event* plus any penalties.
- **5.4.4.** Where a compassionate time allowance is made by the Clerk of the Course in conjunction with the Stewards, it will be applied to the times of the section in which the incident occurred and where possible prior to the commencement of the next section, so that it can be taken into consideration for the *Start* order of that section.
- **5.4.5.** Each score sheet will be required to clearly indicate how many sections make up the *Event* and record total time for each section for each crew.
- 5.4.6. Each score sheet must record total elapsed time for the determination of outright positions.
- **5.4.7.** Each score sheet is required to indicate the names of the nominated primary *Driver* and *Co-Driver/Navigator* as well as the *Automobile* number.

#### 5.5. Postponement OR CANCELLATION OF A COMPETITIONABANDONMENT

A Competition may only be postponed or cancelled for reasons of Force Majeure or safety, or if requirement for doing so has been made in the Supplementary Regulations.

#### 5.6. SUBSTITUTION OF EVENT

The Queensland State Council, on advice from the Queensland Off Road Advisory Panel, reserves the right to substitute an *Event* in the case of a cancellation.

#### 5.7. REFUELLING

5.7.1. Refuelling must only be done in the designated refuelling area.

5.7.2. Any person within 2 metres of refuelling activity must wear non-flammable, neck to wrist to ankle clothing.

#### 5.8. LODGING OF ENTRIES

5.8.1. An Entry will be considered valid if it complies with the Supplementary Regulations. The official Queensland Championship Entry form fully completed (and signed) and accompanied by the required fee must be lodged with the Event Secretary within the period specified. It will be permissible to lodge an Entry by facsimile or by any other approved electronic means of communication as long as it is received before the close of entries.





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#### 5.9. RETURN OF ENTRIES

**5.9.1.** Each *Event Organiser* must specify, in the *Supplementary Regulations*, the conditions for return of *Entry* fees in the case of an *Event* cancellation or *Competitor* withdrawal.

#### 5.10. RECONNAISSANCE

- **5.10.1.** An *Organiser* must provide the opportunity for reconnaissance of the *Course* by crews, subject to the following conditions:
  - **5.10.1.1** A road registered Automobile and/or race Automobile is eligible at the Organiser's discretion.
  - **5.10.1.2** Each occupant must wear a seat belt/harness.
  - **5.10.1.3** Speed is limited to a maximum of 80km/h.
  - **5.10.1.4** Only the *Driver* and *Navigator/Co-Driver* listed on the *Entry* form may participate in reconnaissance.

#### 5.11. EVENT FORMAT

- **5.11.1.** An *Event* may be run either as one section or as multiple sections.
- **5.11.2.** A section will be defined as any part of the race when timing ceases for a break. The field will be regrouped at the beginning of each section.
- **5.11.3.** Where an *Event* is divided into sections, each section will be timed separately for class points. The sections may be run on different days. A crew that does not complete a section will be permitted to start in a subsequent section at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

#### 6. AUTOMOBILE/CREW ELIGIBILITY

- 6.1.1. The Competitor and each Driver and Co-Driver/Navigator must hold the appropriate Motorsport Australia Licence and be a member of a Motorsport Australia Affiliated Club.
- 6.1.2. If the *Driver* of an *Automobile* is less than 18 years old or does not hold a current civil driver's licence, they must be accompanied at all times while competing by a crew member, in the *Automobile*, who either holds a current civil driver's licence or is not less than 18 years old.
- **6.1.3.** *Licence* (refer General Appendix Licence), logbook and any club membership detail must be presented at scrutineering at which time logbooks may be held by the Chief Scrutineer.
- 6.1.4. Each Automobile must comply with the requirements of the Off Road Appendix of the Manual.
- **6.1.5.** With the exception of Pro, Pro-lite, Sports Lite and Extreme 2WD classes, each crew will consist of at least 2 persons, one nominated as the *Driver* and the other as the *Co-Driver* or number one *Navigator*.
- 6.1.6. Each Competitor must nominate on the Entry form the primary Driver and Co-Driver/Navigator for the purpose of allocation of championship points. Where multiple Co-Drivers/Navigators are used at an Event, the first listed on the Entry form will be allocated the points for that Event.

#### 7. SAFETY

#### 7.1. DRIVER AND NAVIGATOR SAFETY / APPAREL

**7.1.1.** Each competing crew member must wear apparel that complies with the Technical Appendix – Schedule D of the *Manual*.

#### 7.2. AUTOMOBILE SAFETY

7.2.1. Each Automobile must comply with the requirements of the Off Road Appendix of the Manual.





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#### 7.3. PIT AND PADDOCK SAFETY

- **7.3.1.** No child under the age of 14 is permitted in the pit area.
- 7.3.2. No motorcycle is to be used in the pit or paddock or any spectator area without the express permission of the property owner and the Event Organiser.
- 7.3.3. Each Competitor will be held responsible with regard to any unauthorised person being found in their pit area.

#### 7.4. ROAD REGISTERED AUTOMOBILES

- 7.4.1. A road registered Automobile must comply with each safety requirement as specified in the Off Road Appendix of the Manual.
- 7.4.2. A Queensland road registered Automobile must have an extension to compulsory third party insurance to compete.

#### **CLASSES OF AUTOMOBILES**

- 8.1. The Championship will be divided into the following classes as per the Off-Road Standing Regulations:

  - **8.1.1.** Pro Buggy **8.1.2.** Pro-lite Buggy
  - 8.1.3. Sportslite
  - 8.1.4. Super 1650 Buggy
  - 8.1.5. Sportsman Buggy
  - 8.1.6. Extreme 2WD
  - 8.1.7. Performance 2WD
  - 8.1.8. Side x Side Turbo
  - 8.1.9. Side x Side Sport
  - 8.1.10. Production 4WD
  - 8.1.11. Extreme 4WD
  - 8.1.12. Extreme Lite

#### SCRUTINEERING 9

- 9.1. Self Scrutiny will be used at each Event. Each Competitor must complete a Statement of Vehicle Compliance and a Self Scrutiny Checklist prior to the Event. Each Organiser must complete full scrutineering on at least 10% of the field. Each Competitor whose Automobile is selected for full scrutineering must be advised at least 24 hours prior to scrutineering being conducted. Automobiles and apparel will also be subject to spot checks at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer during the Event.
- 9.2. An Automobile may be examined for eligibility at any time during an Event and up to 30 minutes after the conclusion of the Event.
- 9.3. Immediately upon the completion of the Event, Automobiles may be impounded by the Clerk the of Course for post-Event eligibility scrutineering. Other Automobile may also be impounded at the Clerk of the Course's discretion for compliance
- 9.4. Any Automobile impounded will be held in Parc Fermé, for up to 30 minutes.
- 9.5. Examination for compliance may be undertaken whilst an Automobile is impounded, and each Competitor may be required to provide mechanical assistance to Scrutineers undertaking such examinations.

### 10. PARC FERMÉ

- 10.1. For regrouping or other reasons, each Automobile may be required to be held in a Parc Fermé. An Event with multiple sections may require an Automobile to be placed in Parc Ferme after an allocated service time, so each Automobile has the same amount of service time regardless of which heat they run in.
- 10.2. Any Automobile which enters a Parc Fermé with its engine running may be restarted with assistance from officials before its release time.
- 10.3. When Parc Fermé conditions are imposed prior to the conclusion of an Event (e.g. for regrouping) the Parc Fermé will be located so that it is possible for crews to go directly to the pits on release from Parc Fermé if required.





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#### **11. POINTSCORE**

- 11.1. To be eligible for Queensland Championship awards at the end of the QORC, each *Driver* and *Co-Driver/Navigator* must have started prologue or a section at ONE of the calendared QORC and scored at least 1 point or more.
- **11.2.** The Co-Driver/Navigator will receive the same points as the Driver of the Automobile in which they are competing for both class and outright results.
- **11.3.** Each *Driver* and *Co-Driver/Navigator* that starts either the prologue or the first lap of Section 1 of an *Event* will receive 10 class points and 1 outright point.

#### **12. CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS**

**12.1.** The award for Queensland Off Road Champion *Driver* and *Co-Driver/Navigator* only will be presented at the *Motorsport Australia* 'Evening of Champions'. Second and third positions (*Driver* and *Co-Driver/Navigator*) plus the winning *Driver* in each class will be awarded trophies which will be supplied from the Trophy Levy.

#### 13. CLASS POINTS

**13.1.** Class points will be allocated equally for each section regardless of distance. To be eligible for class points a crew must complete the total distance of that section within the specified time allocated by the *Event Organiser*.

13.2. Class points will be awarded as follows:

**13.3.** When an *Event* is stopped or otherwise shortened for any reason, class points will be awarded according to the *Event* format and number of sections the leading *Automobile* has completed when the *Event* is stopped, as per the following.

13.3.1. When the Event is being run as one section

- if less than 25% of the scheduled distance has been covered, no class points will be awarded.
- if 25% but not more than 75% of the scheduled distance has been completed, 50% of the available points will be awarded; or
- if more than 75% of the scheduled distance has been completed points will be awarded as though the scheduled distance had been covered.
- **13.3.2.** When the *Event* is being run as <u>two or more sections</u>: points will be allocated for those sections completed, in accordance with the appropriate scale (for the number of sections scheduled as above). No points will be allocated for any section not completed or which is stopped before the scheduled time for completion.

#### **14. OUTRIGHT POINTS**

- **14.1.** Outright points will be distributed, according to each crew's total elapsed time for all sections after any penalties are applied.
- 14.2. To be eligible for outright points a crew must complete 100% of the race distance.





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1<sup>st</sup> - 120 points; 2<sup>nd</sup> - 90 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> - 72 points; 4<sup>th</sup> - 60 points; 5<sup>th</sup> - 48 points; 6<sup>th</sup> - 36 points; 7<sup>th</sup> 24 points; 8<sup>th</sup> - 18 points; 9<sup>th</sup> - 12 points; 10<sup>th</sup> - 6 points. The remainder of finishers each receive 4 points.

14.4. When an *Event* is stopped or otherwise shortened for any reason, outright points will be awarded according to the number of sections the leading *Automobile* has completed when the *Event* is stopped.

- if less than 25% of the scheduled distance has been covered, no outright points will be awarded.
  - if 25% but not more than 75% of the scheduled distance has been completed, 50% of the available points will be awarded; or
- if more than 75% of the scheduled distance has been completed points will be awarded as though the scheduled had been covered.

#### 15. TIES

- **15.1.** <u>Outright</u>: If two or more *Drivers* or two or more *Co-Drivers/Navigators* have accumulated equal points at the end of the QORC, the final positions will be determined by the greater number of higher outright *Event* finishing positions.
- **15.2.** <u>Class</u>: If two or more *Drivers* or two or more *Co-Drivers/Navigators* have accumulated equal points at the end of the QORC, the final positions will be determined by the greater number of higher class section finishing positions.
- **15.3.** If this methodology does not determine the result, a tie will be declared.

#### 16. ENTRY FEES

**16.1.** Included in the *Entry* fee will be the Off-Road Trophy Levy of \$15.00 per *Entry*.

#### **17. PARENTAL CONSENT**

17.1. If any *Competitor*, *Driver*, *Co-Driver*, *Navigator* or pit crew is under 18 years of age, it must be stated on the *Entry* form together with the signed consent of a parent or guardian. Each *Entry* form must contain provision for the address and telephone number of a consenting guardian.

#### **18. INSURANCE**

18.1. The Event Organiser must arrange public risk insurance with Motorsport Australia. Personal accident insurance for all officials, Drivers, Co-Drivers, Navigators, and pit crew (nominated on the Entry form and duly signed) will be arranged with Motorsport Australia. <u>Insurance-Guide---Motorsport-Australia---july-2023</u>.

#### **19. ALCOHOL/ PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES**

**19.1.** The consumption of alcohol or any prohibited substance by a *Driver*, *Co-Driver*, *Navigator* or team member (including pit crew) is forbidden during the *Event*. Consumption of alcohol or prohibited substances by anyone in the pit, paddock and other non-public areas is forbidden until all *Competition* is concluded for each day of the *Event*. Refer to the *Manual*.

#### **20. OFFICIAL REGISTRAR**

20.1. The 2025 Championship Registrar is:

**20.2.** It is the responsibility of an *Event Organiser* to notify the Registrar of the *Final Classification* for the *Event* within 7 days of *Event* completion.

#### 21. EVENT TROPHIES

- **21.1.** Trophies will be awarded at the discretion of the organising club and these awards will be defined in *Supplementary Regulations*.
- **21.2.** At the completion of each *Event*, the organising club will present trophies for that *Event*. (Completion of the *Event* means every *Automobile* has stopped racing.)





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- 21.3. Trophies awarded at the Organiser's discretion may reflect different place getters than the official point-score according to the method of discernment.
- 21.4. It is recommended that a finishing certificate be awarded to each crew that places in the top three in their class if they do not receive a trophy.

### 22. PENALTIES

**22.1.** Failure to comply with a specified control procedure.

22.1.1. 30 minutes added to start time.

- 22.2. Short cut or other deviation from the Course.
  - 22.2.1. First breach during the Event, up to and including 30 minutes added to section time.
  - 22.2.2. Second breach during the Event, up to and including Disqualification.
  - 22.2.3. Any breach during prologue, up to and including 30 minutes added to the prologue time.
- 22.3. Causing damage to property, deemed by the Clerk of the Course to have been deliberate.
  - **22.3.1.** Up to and including *Disqualification*.
- 22.4. Refuelling whilst the Automobile engine is not switched off.

22.4.1. Up to and including Disqualification.

- **22.5.** Refuelling whilst any person is inside the *Automobile*.
  - **22.5.1.** Up to and including *Disqualification*.
- 22.6. Refuelling outside designated area.
  - **22.6.1.** Up to and including *Disqualification*.
- 22.7. Breach of Parc Ferme.
  - **22.7.1.** Up to and including 100 minutes added to section time.
- 22.8. False Start / Jump Start.
  - **22.8.1.** Prologue 1 minute added to section 1 time.
  - 22.8.2. Section 5 minutes added to section time at the end of the Event.
- 22.9. Receiving outside servicing.
  - 22.9.1. Up to and including Disqualification.
- **22.10.** A penalty may only be imposed by the Stewards.

#### 23 OTHER

WATERING OF COURSE

In order to comply with relevant Local Government requirements, where applicable, or to reduce dust and the like, it may be necessary to water the *Course* at intervals during the *Event*. Specific conditions will be detailed in the *Event Supplementary Regulations*.

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
