# AUTO TEST APPENDIX GO TO WHOA STANDING REGULATIONS



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A capitalised and italicised word in this document is defined in the FIA International Sporting Code (Code) or the National Competition Rules (NCR), including their Appendices.

Any HEADING is for reference only and has no regulatory effect.

## 1. AUTHORITY

A Go to Whoa Event will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia, these Standing Regulations and the Supplementary Regulations for the Event.

#### 2. LICENCES

Fach Driver must hold a minimum of a:

Junior Speed Licence applicable for a Go to Whoa Competition; or

Speed Licence.

Refer General Appendix - Competition Licences.

#### 3. AUTOMOBILES

## 3.1 Eligibility

Each Automobile entered in a Go to Whoa must comply with Technical Appendix - Schedules A and B.

## 3.2 Classes

At the discretion of the Organiser, each Automobile may be grouped into a Class.

Each capacity class will be in accordance with those specified for the relevant category – refer Technical Appendix – Classification of Automobiles. An additional capacity class may be included at the discretion of the *Organiser*.

#### 4. SCRUTINEERING

Refer NCR.

#### 5. THE COURSE

A Go to Whoa *Competition* must take place on a course that provides appropriate protection for Competitors, Spectators, Media and Officials.

Although Go to Whoa **Competition's** commonly take place on a Drag Strip, Permanent Circuit Racing Venue, or Burnout pit, other locations are also permitted. The course may be conducted on a sealed or unsealed surface. Regardless of the Competition Venue, the following conditions must be complied with. The course must:

- (i) must be as flat and as smooth as practical and free of any hazard; and
- (ii) Be no more than 150m from the foremost point of the Start garage until the First point of the End garage/line; and
- (iii) have the entry location clearly identified; and
- (iv) have the exit location clearly identified and arranged such that each *Automobile* must affect at least 2 direction changes to exit the Go to Whoa Course, i.e. barrier set up as a chicane, bus stop or other design approved by Motorsport Australia; and

- (v) have each official located behind the first line of protection; and
- (vi) The Competition and pit area must be separate from the spectator area in which spectator marshals may be appointed; and
- (vii) for each Test, only the Automobile, Driver and Passenger are permitted within the Competition area; and
- (viii) An adequate runoff must be provided at the rear of the finish garage/line which separates it from the spectator area; and
- (ix) Have a continuous first line of protection that separates any spectators and officials from the course where they are less than 20 meters from the competition surface. Any barrier must have a Austroads Safety Barrier Assessment Panel (ASBAP) rating of 70km/h or more.

## 6. TIMING

Timing will be recorded to a minimum of 0.01 second.

Timing will commence when the leading point of the *Automobile* crosses the Start Line and end when the *Automobile* is stationary with the front wheels in contact with the finish line.

Timing may be automatic or manual. If automatic timing is used the Organiser must provide manual timing as a back-up.

## 7. RUNNING ORDER

The running order for each Class must follow the order listed in the Official Program.

The running order must ensure that each run or re-run for a particular *Automobile* is separated by a period of more than 5 minutes, irrespective of whether more than 1 *Driver* is entered in the *Automobile*.

### 8. TYRE WARMING

A Burnout before the start of a run, as well as any other method to artificially heat a tyre and/or wheel is prohibited.

# 9. RE-RUNS

A re-run will only be permitted due to the following:

Failure of timing equipment:

The signal to Start having been given when the Course was not clear;

If for any reason the rear wheels of the Automobile fail to reach the Start Line; or

If the Clerk of the Course determines that the Course has become unsuitable for Competition.

# 10. SAFETY

A speed limit of 10 km/h applies in any non-competition area.

A first aid kit and a 4 kg fire extinguisher be provided by the Organiser adjacent to the start garage.

#### 11. DRIVERS

(a) Each Driver must wear apparel and use a seat belt compliant with Technical Appendix - Schedule D and I. 8.2 The minimum age for a Driver is 14 years at the time of the Competition.

# 12. PASSENGERS

A Passenger is permitted subject to the following conditions:

- (i) Each Passenger must complete the Motorsport Australia "Passenger in Vehicle Disclaimer Form" before any *Competition*; and
- (ii) Only 1 Passenger is permitted in the Automobile with the Driver at any time during a *Competition*; and

(iii) Each Passenger must wear apparel and use a seat belt compliant with Technical Appendix – Schedule D and I.

## 13. RESULTS

If the number of runs is to be fewer than that stated in the *Supplementary Regulations*, the Clerk of the Course will make an announcement to this effect prior to the commencement of the final runs.

The *Driver* who records the fastest time, inclusive of any penalty, and other than in practice will be declared the winner.

If there is a tie, the next fastest time, inclusive of any penalty, and other than in practice will be taken into account, and so on until a result is determined.

Class results will be determined on the same basis.
