Any HEADING is for reference only and has no regulatory effect.

1. AUTHORITY

A Vehicle Demonstration will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules of *Motorsport Australia*, these Standing Regulations and the *Supplementary Regulations* for the *Event*.

2. INTRODUCTION

A Vehicle Demonstration is conducted on a Circuit holding a Motorsport Australia Track Licence.

Any Vehicle Demonstration at a Circuit that is referred as setting or attempting to set a lap record, in any form, must comply with the Circuit Lap record Attempt Standing Regulations.

3. OFFICIALS

Each Essential Official will be appointed as per the NCR.

When a Vehicle Demonstration activity occurs at a race meeting, all officials required for the race meeting must remain in position whilst this activity is in progress.

When a Vehicle Demonstration is performed outside of a race meeting, then the circuit must have at least the same number of trackside officials as required for a speed event at that venue.

4. AUTOMOBILES

Each *Automobile* must comply with Technical Appendix - Schedules A and B of the *Manual* and be an *Automobile* that would be permitted to compete on that Circuit.

Tyres are subject to Scrutineer's approval.

After scrutineering, an *Automobile* which has been modified in any way which may affect its safety must be represented for further examination prior to starting a run.

Any Electric Vehicle (EV) used under these regulations must be compliant with the Electric Vehicle Standing Regulations.

Any Automobile that would not normally be permitted to compete on a Circuit may apply to Motorsport Australia for approval to perform a Vehicle Demonstration.

5. LICENCES

Each *Driver* must hold a Motorsport Australia Speed Licence or higher to perform this activity. Refer to the General Appendix – Competition Licences of the *Manual*.

6. DRIVER APPAREL

Driver apparel including helmet must comply with Technical Appendix - Schedule D of the Manual for a Speed Event:

7. PADDOCK SPEED LIMIT

A limit of 10 km/h will apply in the paddock area.

8. TIMING

No Official Timing is permitted for a Vehicle Demonstration.

9. PASSENGERS

Passengers are permitted in a Vehicle Demonstration only where the passenger ride is compliant with the Motorsport Australia Passenger Ride Policy (MSPRA).

10. PROCEDURE

The Supplementary Regulations and/or Driver briefing must include at least the following:

direction of travel;

flag signals;

number of Automobiles on the Course simultaneously;

number of laps per "run";

procedure for returning to the paddock.
