



APPENDIX R - 2025 Motorsport Australia WA FORMULA CLASSIC STATE SERIES

R1. OBJECTIVE

1.1 The objective of the series is to promote and foster racing for Historic Racing and Sports Cars manufactured prior to December 31st 1994.

R2. CATEGORY ORGANISERS

- 2.1 The Category Organiser is Formula Classic Racing Inc. (FCR Inc.)
- 2.2 Category Representative: Craig Thompson
- 2.3 Category Eligibility Officer: Ricky Virago
 - a. The Category Eligibility Officers will be appointed by the Motorsport Australia Western Australia Motor Race Advisory Panel (WAMRAP). Interim or substitute Category Eligibility Officers may be added to by the Category Organisers, which is to be ratified by WAMRAP, and the relevant *Event Organisers* and the Clerk of the Course are to be advised.

R3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1 Cars compliant with the applicable Historic Appendix 5th Category – Historic Cars technical regulations and technical bulletins issued by Motorsport Australia, and issued with a log book for the following classes.

- a. Racing and Sports Cars built before December 31st 1994 and complying with the Technical Regulations as per the Motorsport Australia *Manual* of Motorsport for the year in which the car was manufactured.
- Invited cars complying with the Motorsport Australia Free Formula for Race Events
 Technical Regulations, and subject to approval by Motorsport Australia in line with Circuit Race Standing Regulations, Clause 2.2.
- 3.2 Each car shall comply with the "General Requirements for Cars and Drivers" from the Motorsport Australia *Manual* of Motorsport.
- 3.3 Due to the limited space in some single seater race cars, handheld fire extinguishers fitted in accordance with Motorsport Australia Technical Appendix Schedule H may be fitted externally to the *Automobile* and out of reach of the *Driver*, but should be easily accessible by persons outside the *Automobile*.

R4. SERIES & POINTSCORE

- 4.1 A separate point score shall be maintained for the Outright Series and for the Handicap Series.
- 4.2 For the Outright Series, the Motorsport Australia WA State Circuit Racing Championship Sporting and Series Regulations Point Scores will be used.
- 4.3 Trophies provided by the Event Organisers at each round shall cover 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the Outright Series.
- 4.4 The Category Organiser will award points to Handicap placegetters at each round and publish the progressive standings on the Formula Classic website.
- 4.5 At the conclusion of the season trophies shall be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place finishers in the Handicap Series.

R5. COMPETITION NUMBERS

5.1 *Competitors* may request and reserve a competition number, which will be allocated for their *Driver's* use at each round of the series.

R6. RACES

- 6.1 Races will be conducted during scheduled Series rounds, and races may be spread over one or two days in consultation with the Event Organiser.
- 6.2 The series will be conducted over no less than 5 rounds.
- 6.3 Each round of the Series shall comprise a minimum of 3 sprint races. If more races are held, all will count towards the point score.
- 6.4 Grid positions will be determined for the first race according to the qualifying times and thereafter by progressive grids.
- 6.5 In the event of more than one qualifying session being scheduled, grid positions will be determined according to a *Driver's* best time in any session.

R7. SPONSORS

7.1 *Competitors* shall carry any *Series* sponsor stickers in a clearly visible location as nominated by the Category Organisers for *Series* sponsors.
