



Appendix K - 2025 MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA West Australian Saloon Car State Championship

1. TITLE AND JURISDICTION

- 1.1 The 2025 Motorsport Australia Western Australian Saloon Car State Championship shall be conducted under the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA, the National Competition Rules (NCR) and The Circuit Race Standing Regulations (CRSR) of Motorsport Australia, the Sporting and Technical Regulations issued by Motorsport Australia; Supplementary Regulations issued by the Promoter at each Round; Bulletins issued by the Stewards of the Event and any further regulations as issued.
- 1.2 The Championship shall only be referred to as the 2025 Motorsport Australia Rightway Industrial West Australian Saloon Car State Championship.

2. CATEGORY ORGANISERS

- 2.1 The Category Organisers of the *Championship* shall be West Australian Saloon Car Association Inc, herein referred to as "the Organisers."
- 2.2 *Category Manager (CM)*: West Australian Saloon Car Association Inc
- 2.3 *Eligibility Officer: (EO)*: Will be ratified by the MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA WA Motor Race Advisory Panel (WAMRAP). Interim or substitute Category Eligibility Officers may be added at any time by the Category Organisers which is to be ratified by WAMRAP, and the relevant Event Organisers and the Clerk of the Course are to be advised.

3. AUTOMOBILE MARKINGS

- 3.1 Each *Automobile* must display the following State Championship markings, appropriately attached, and always positioned as detailed below during each Round of the Championship.
- 3.2 Failure to display the markings in accordance with the State Championship regulations will deem the *Driver* of the *Automobile* ineligible for State Championship Points for all sessions the markings are incorrect.
- 3.3 Penalties in accordance with 3.2 will not be applicable where the Category Organisers are unable to provide any of the below markings.
- 3.4 The Category Organisers will provide the following State Championship markings.

- a. Upper portion of front windscreen - Sub Sponsor as directed by the Category Organisers.
- b. Number Plates - Sub Sponsor as directed by the Category Organisers.
- c. Front Guards - Sub Sponsor as directed by the Category Organisers.
- d. Rear Windscreen- Sub Sponsor as directed by the Category Organisers.
- e. Lower Portion of doors – Sub sponsor as directed by the Category Organisers.
- f. Lower Portion of Front Windscreen, Passenger side – *Driver's* Nickname
- g. Above Car Competition Number - Sub sponsor as directed by the Category Organisers.
- h. Back of Mirrors - Sub Sponsor as directed by the Category Organisers.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND CLASSES

- 4.1 The championship will consist of 2 classes, each complying with 3rd Category Group K Saloon Car Technical Regulations.
- 4.2 Classes will be as per 3.1 and 3.2 of the current Circuit Race Appendix 3rd Category – Touring Cars, Group 3K Saloon Car Technical Regulations.
 - a. Pro Class: *Automobiles* compliant with Group A
 - b. Pro-Am Class: *Automobiles* compliant with Group B
- 4.3 Each *Competitor* must supply a camera video recording device which must be fitted to each of their *Automobiles* in each qualifying and race sessions at every *Event/Round*.
 - a. The camera and associated equipment will be installed in the *Automobile* with the camera pointed in a forward direction with a field of vision sufficiently wide enough to always record clearly and without obstruction the track ahead and *Driver's* steering input.
 - b. The *Competitor* will be required to ensure that a data card is installed in the camera and that it is switched on and functioning in the correct manner prior to the *Automobile* entering the *Track* for each qualifying and race session at every *Event*.
 - c. The camera must remain functioning and record vision to the data card for the entire time that the *Automobile* is on the *Track*.
 - d. Access to the camera's recordings must be provided to the Clerk of the Course, Deputy Clerk of the Course, Assistant Clerk of the Course, Chief Scrutineer or Stewards of the Event at any time upon request along with the appropriate cable or card to attach to an SD or USB socket.
 - e. If the camera recording cannot be provided as directed by any official list at 4(iii)d), disqualification from the session in question may be applied.

5. CHAMPIONSHIP ROUNDS AND POINTS

- 5.1 Points will be awarded in accordance with the 2025 Motorsport Australia WA State Circuit Racing Championship Sporting an Series Regulations.
- 5.2 A maximum of the first three races at each *Round* will receive State Championship points.
- 5.3 Round 5 may Include a 2nd driver. The Accumulated points for the *Automobile* will be given to any driver in that *Automobile*. A *Driver* can only accumulate points from 1 *Automobile*.
- 5.4 Round 7 Race 1 is double points
- 5.6 Any *Round* held the same weekend as the Saloon Car Nationals becomes a non-championship round.
- 5.7 After Round 7, *Drivers* shall only use the top scoring six (6) *State Championship Rounds* (or top five (5) if a clash occurs with the Saloon Car Nationals), dropping the lowest scoring *Round*

- 5.8 between 1 and 7 (or 6 if there is a clash with the Saloon Car Nationals).
The final *Round* (Rd 8) must be included and count for points.
